**1. RT. 518 BRIDGE REPLACEMENT**

The deck has been removed from the structure as work continues.

All the additional signs requested to alert people the downtown businesses were open have been installed

**2. PROJECTS**

**Montgomery Avenue** – At the last meeting the Borough made the final payment to the Contractor. We can now do the necessary paperwork to submit for payment to the state. We will need copies of all the checks, both front and back, as part of the submission documents.

**Generator Grant** – We met with the Engineer on Tuesday January 10<sup>th</sup>. Full plans and specifications should be in hand by Mid-February if not sooner.

We are still on track to have this work accomplished this spring. This is well in advance of the deadline which is June of 2017.

#### **4. SPOT REPAIRS ON SIDEWALKS/ MISCELLANEOUS**

I have pulled together a group of small projects that will send them out to a couple of contractors for a quote. Specifically:

1. 24 linear feet of sidewalk near the library on Washington Street
2. The water meter box for the Rescue Squad.
3. The repair of an existing house street valve which is broken at 78 Princeton Avenue. This would also entail some sidewalk replacement. The price I received was too high to consider without a second quote.

#### **5. COUNTY ROAD PROJECTS FOR THE BOROUGH**

The County began the repair at 11 Princeton Avenue. Their original exploration does not indicate that the pipe is leaking and may be more due to the backfill settling. Since the curb has settled, the County suggested the curb be replaced. Attached is a copy of the quote for the replacement of curb.

The County has a list of pothole repairs that they will begin fixing as part of the project above. This includes resetting of several water valves.

#### **6. WASHINGTON STREET SIDEWALK CONTRACT**

We will submit this coming week if we are able to get copies of the checks (back & front) paid to the contractor.

#### **7. STAGE II TREATMENT PLANT**

On hold pending information from Montgomery on the proposed study.

#### **8. SEWER FLOWS**

A budget will be prepared for your consideration for potential inclusion in this year's budget. At league this year we were shown a way to video the manholes which may be useful in the task as it maps out all the areas that indicate leaks.

#### **9. COUNTY ROAD STRIPING**

For follow up once the County awards a contract.

#### **10. LEAF PICKUP**

Completed. There is one pile at 49 Crescent that will be picked up by JML this week.

11. **EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT**

Still waiting on the Eagle Scout proposal; in the meantime a Girl Scout has proposed a Gold Star Project (the equivalent to Eagle Scout) do a portion as well.

12. **NEW ORDINANCE – FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION**

Completed and sent to the State.

13. **FIRE HYDRANT AND VALVE EXERCISING**

During the recent watermain break repair we had problems turning the water valve off on Washington Street. The valve box cover was “glued” onto the valve box. The valve box extension had to be chopped out and removed. The entire valve box was packed with mud and luckily Tim Lesko was able to clean it out and close the valve. Had the valve not been operable we would have had to close the next valve up the line which would have shut off the water to the whole Borough.

I suggest we put out as contract this year to exercise every valve in the Borough and replace the broken ones. Concurrently we would do the same with fire hydrants.

If the Governing agrees we will put out a contract this Spring.

Dear Mayor/Freeholder Director/County Executive:

On behalf of Governor Chris Christie I am pleased to announce that applications will now be accepted for the New Jersey Department of Transportation's (NJDOT) FY 2017 State Aid programs. As Commissioner of Transportation we are committed to maintaining and improving New Jersey's local transportation infrastructure by providing financial assistance to counties and municipalities for traditional and non-traditional transportation initiatives.

The following is a brief description of each program:

- **Municipal Aid** - This program has been a significant resource for municipalities in funding local transportation projects. All municipalities are eligible. The Department continues to encourage municipalities to consider using the Municipal Aid Program to fund projects that support walking and biking in their communities. NJDOT has set a goal to award up to 10% of the Municipal Aid Program funds to projects such as pedestrian safety improvements, bikeways and streetscapes.
- **Transit Village** - This program will award grants for traditional and non-traditional transportation projects that enhance walking, biking and/or transit ridership within 1/2 mile of the transit facility. Only New Jersey municipalities that have been designated as Transit Villages by the Commissioner of Transportation and the inter-agency Transit Village Task Force are eligible to apply. The eligible town list can be found at <http://www.state.nj.us/transportation/business/localaid/transitvillagef.shtml>
- **Bikeways** - This program is intended to fund bicycle projects which create new Bike Path Mileage. It is available to all counties and municipalities. The Department continues to work toward the goal of achieving 1,000 miles of dedicated bikeways in New Jersey. Special consideration will be given to bikeways that are physically separated from motorized vehicular traffic by an open space or barrier, but on-road bike lanes and other bike routes and facilities are also eligible for funding.
- **Safe Streets to Transit** - The intent of this program is to encourage counties and municipalities to construct safe and accessible pedestrian linkages to transit facilities, in order to promote increased usage of transit by all segments of the population.

If you choose to apply, please consider the following in your applications. NJDOT requires grant projects to be awarded to construction within 24 months from the date of grant notification.


I encourage you to submit applications for these Local Aid programs. Each program application will be evaluated independently, affording counties and municipalities the opportunity to receive funding in more than one category.
