Buildings & Grounds - J. Hagemann

1. Straightened the basketball pole by the shed.
2. Realigned the basketball backboard on that pole.

7. Cleaned up the fallen trees on Panicaro Park, had the landscape company cut a straight line.

Generator Grant - The final paperwork is in hand and final payment is on the bill list this evening. Final paperwork will be filed with FEMA over the next several weeks..

Princeton Avenue Phase III - NJDOT is requiring cores of the road which have been ordered.

Lemore Pipe Repair - Revisions to the contract need to be made due to incorrect calculated costs.

Miscellaneous Road Repairs - JML Contract completed. A new issue, an inlet in the cul-de-sac on Hickory Court needs to be repaired.

Water Connection Requests - A letter has been sent to NJDEP requesting some relief on the connection Moratorium. We have not received a response.

BPU Fine -The fine has been paid.

2019 Local Aid Projects - The resolution needed to finalize the application for this year has been sent to NJDOT.

Sewer Study - The subcommittee met via a conference call. The following was discussed:

1. Mr. Sibley has purchased, and will install, for minimal cost, several devices that will be able to measure the water surface of the adjacent water surface level if the streams overflow their banks.
2. After several discussions with one of the VCEA sewer experts, we are proposing that the Borough set aside approximately \$2,000.00 to allow two employees of VCEA to open manholes in the evening after rainfalls to see where the lines may be leaking. This might eliminate the cost of installing temporary meters in location in the sewer system.
3. The same VCEA sewer expert will also be talking to the Montgomery Sewer Operator to see if more exact flow information might be available.
4. The subcommittee also discussed less expensive ways that we may be able to use to fix some of the infiltration issues.

Leaf Collection

The first collection of leaves that was supposed to be done before Halloween was cancelled due to no leaves. Our next scheduled collection should be the week before Thanksgiving.



Monday's meeting will include a brief discussion of future zoning ideas for Rocky Hill. As you know, the Planning Board has been considering several zoning recommendations for the Master Plan Re-examination report.

The Board is currently split on what to recommend for Rocky Hill's business district. Therefore, I'd like to bring Council up to speed on what PB has been discussing, and consider your opinions as well.

The Board generally agrees to recommend expansion of the business zone; this idea stems from the following:

- It is our CFO's opinion that the Borough's residential tax burden is proportionately too high, and therefore unsustainable; thus we should consider increasing the number of commercial properties.
- There is general agreement that it would be beneficial to continue beautifying and increasing the functionality of Rocky Hill's village center.
- Comments received in our online Master Plan survey indicated interest in adding a few more shops, eateries, and/or small businesses.

HOW to expand the Washington Street business zone is where there are differing opinions among PB members. Here are ideas we are considering:

- (a) Expansion to the east (i.e., toward One53)
- (b) Expansion to the west (i.e., toward Montgomery Ave)
- (c) Creation of an office zone at the western border
- (d) A combination of (a), (b), and (c)
- (e) New commercial zone(s) elsewhere in Rocky Hill
- (f) None of the above - no future expansion

I should note that the Board agrees that the Borough's parking problem needs a viable solution before any business expansion occurs.

WHEREAS, Lemore Circle is in need of drainage repairs; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer prepared specs and solicited quotes from JML Landscaping, T. Fiotakis Construction LLC and DeSantis Construction; and

WHEREAS, the only quote that was received was from T. Fiotakis Construction, LLC in the amount of \$16,040.00.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council awarded the contract to T. Fiotakis Construction at a regular meeting held on September 17, 2018; and

WHEREAS, there was an error in the bid tabulation spreadsheet and the cost of the project was larger than \$16,040.00; and

WHEREAS, due to the total costs of all three phases of the contract, the Borough of Rocky Hill desires to rescind its prior award of contract for all three phases in the amount of \$16,040.00 and award the contract to T. Fiotakis in the amount of \$14,150.00 for the completion of Phase I only of the specifications; and

WHEREAS, the total value of these services for the year 2018 is less than \$17,500 and, therefore, these services are exempt from the Local Unit Pay-to-Play law, N.J.S.A. 19:44A-27.7 et seq.; and

WHEREAS, approval of said resolution is conditioned upon there being sufficient funds in the Borough’s budget to pay for these services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Rocky Hill, County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, as follows:

- 1. That the Borough Council extends the award of contracts as follows:

3. Minutes of said discussion will be made available as soon as it is deemed in the public interest to do so.
4. The Borough Council may take official action on those items discussed in executive session upon completion of the executive session.
